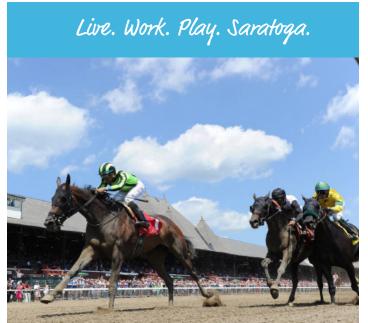

Rich in historical assets, such as its namesake mineral springs, the Saratoga Race Track and the Saratoga National Battlefield, Saratoga County is now making history with a thriving technology sector. In addition to housing North America's most advanced chip fab, the county has rapidly expanding chemical manufacturing and software development industries. Prime commercial real estate opportunities near Exit 16 of the Adirondack Northway (I-87) are also fueling growth of the county's transportation and warehousing industry, which has already attracted major distribution centers for Target and Ace Hardware.

The county seat, Saratoga Springs, has been named America's Most Beautiful Small Towns by U.S. News & World Report, one of the Best Small Cities in America by WalletHub, and one of the Best Cities for Getting Away with the Girls by Travel+Leisure.
